


Jesus said: I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live: Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life. Every one which seeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day. (John 11.25; 5.24; 6.40) Therefore, to be saved you must dispose of all other beliefs. You must quit trusting in religious sacrifices, beliefs confessions, good works, purgatory...and you must put your faith in Christ Jesus, trusting only in the power of His sacrifice to take away your sins. To continue seeking the favor of God through good works or sincerity is to doubt the power and value of Christ's sacrifice. We are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all... For by one offering he hath perfected for ever them that are sanctified... Wherefore he is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them. (Hebrews 10.10,14; 7.25) If you want to be saved, decide now to trust and believe only in the sacrifice of Christ and ask Him to forgive your sins and save you. Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me hath everlasting life... and shall not come into condemnation;



About 2000 years ago, a man named Jesus Christ died, nailed by the hands and the feet to a wooden cross. He had done nothing wrong—He had been unjustly accused and wrongfully executed. Three days and three nights later He rose from His grave, becoming the most influential man in history. Despite the multitude of opinions about Him and His death, the Scriptures set forth the following affirmations:
